2005 Ship Production Symposium Call For Papers

Submissions for the Ship Production Symposium will be accepted in one of two categories:

1. Published paper with a presentation at the conference.
2. Presentation (PowerPoint) at the conference (no paper prepared for publication).

The goal for the SPS sessions is 2/3 published papers with presentations, and 1/3 presentations only. The SNAME Ship Production Committee, composed of the NSRP Ship Production Panel Chairs, will make the determination as to which submissions will be accepted. Any topics related to ship production are acceptable for submission.

Timeline for SPS Submissions (applies to both Paper and Presentation-only formats)

February 10, 2005	Abstracts due (Rough Draft Papers Preferred)
March 15, 2005	Selected authors are notified
May 12, 2005	Rough Draft due for review and comment
June 30, 2005	Final comments passed onto authors
August 5, 2005	Final electronic submissions due for publication

Abstracts should be submitted in the format provided below. The Theme should be described in sufficient detail such that the abstract fills at least one page. **Rough Draft papers may be submitted on February 10th and are encouraged.** All papers must be submitted following the traditional SNAME format described at www.sname.org/author_instructions.htm. This site also contains guidelines for PowerPoint presentations (a template will be provided at a later date). Ship Production Symposium Abstract Format:

- Title: Provide title (6 words maximum).
- Author: Provide the name, address, phone, fax number and e-mail address of the lead author, and the names of the contributing authors.
- Category: Note the intended category: Technical Paper with Presentation, or Presentation Only (without paper).
- Theme: Provide in any format, the main theme/synopsis of the paper (or presentation). The abstract must contain enough detail to allow Technical Committee members to determine suitability for inclusion in the Ship Production Symposium.
