Mini-Grant Program Guidelines

These Mini-Grant Program Guidelines explain a grant program established by the PNW Section of Society of Naval Architects and Marine Engineers (SNAME).

Philosophy of the Mini-Grant

The grant funds awarded annually are to be used by students in support of material purchases, up to \$500 USD associated with academic projects. The grant program is intended to further research in the maritime field, specifically Marine Engineering, Naval Architecture or Ocean Engineering and encourage industry participation with area maritime universities. Eligible students shall be attending a university within the PNW Section boundaries, offering an undergraduate or graduate degree in the engineering sciences. It is required that the candidates' studies emphasize the marine field.

Evaluation Committee from Local SNAME

An evaluation committee will be established to administer the program. The committee may deem phone interviews of applicants necessary. The evaluation committee will be made up of 3 members as follows:

- Committee Chair – PNW Student Liaison
- PNW Section Chairman
- Past PNW Section Chairman

Award Amount May Vary

It is expected that as much as \$2,000 USD may be awarded each year. The award will be divided between multiple candidates, with a maximum of \$500 USD per project without the further approval of the PNW Executive Committee.

The mini-grant is awarded by the Society of Naval Architects and Marine Engineers, PNW Section. To qualify, a student must be a U.S. or Canadian citizen pursuing a Bachelor's or advanced degree in an accredited engineering program. Students must be entering their junior, senior or graduate studies in the spring of 2005 to qualify.

Student projects accepted into the mini-grant program must either 1) make a presentation at a local section meeting or 2) submit a paper concerning the project topic to the local section.

Be as complete as possible while filling out this application. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
