



Society of Naval Architects and Marine Engineers Pacific Northwest Section Scholarship Program

These Scholarship Program Guidelines explain a scholarship program established by the PNW Section of Society of Naval Architects and Marine Engineers (SNAME).

Philosophy of the Scholarship

The scholarship is intended to further education in the marine field, specifically Marine Engineering, Naval Architecture, or Ocean Engineering. Eligible students shall be attending a university within the PNW Section boundaries, offering an undergraduate or graduate degree in the engineering sciences. It is required that the candidates' studies emphasize the marine field.

SNAME Provides an Application Form to Ensure Use of Consistent Criteria

A Scholarship Application Form is used by applicants desiring to be considered by the Scholarship committee and is included as an attachment in the accompanying materials. It is necessary that consistent criteria be used to judge the applicants, as unequal criteria could be considered discriminatory. Non-standard applications will not be considered because of discrimination issues.

Evaluation Committee from Local SNAME

An evaluation committee will be established to administer the program. The committee may deem phone interviews of applicants necessary. The evaluation committee will be made up of 3 members as follows:

- Committee Chair – PNW Student Liaison
- PNW Section Chairman
- Past PNW Section Chairman

Award Amount May Vary

- It is expected that as much as \$1,000 USD may be awarded, per student, each academic year. The award will be divided between multiple candidates from PNW schools.

Application Deadline

Applications will not be accepted any later than June 8. Scholarship recipients will be notified by July 6 for the upcoming academic year.

Scoring

In Major Grade Point Average: 5 points

Essay: 30 points

Essays must be typed or neatly printed. Points may be lost for poor grammar, incorrect spelling and lack of neatness or illegibility. Proofread carefully.

Work Experience: 10 points

List your most recent work experience first and include any jobs held during high school. Indicate the year in school during which you held a particular position. Indicate if your work experience was in the form of work-study, coop, or practicum. Clearly identify the nature of the business of the listed employers; in particular, note consulting engineering firms or shipyards. Be complete and accurate. List additional experiences on a separate sheet and attach if necessary. The more experience you list, the higher your score potential.

Recommendation: 10 points

A recommendation is needed from an engineering professor or a professional engineer in the marine industry. Use the enclosed form—a letter generally is not sufficient. The evaluator must send the recommendation directly to the Chief Reviewer (address on Recommendation Form).

College Activities: 15 points

Indicate all college activities including offices held in any organization. Be as complete as possible. If there are no activities, write "none." The more activities you list, the higher your score potential on this portion of the assessment.

Additional Awards and Honors: 5 points

Indicate all awards and honors you have received. Be as complete as possible.
