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SNAME Qualifications for Fellow

Per SNAME bylaws "the grade of Fellow may be accorded exclusively to individuals who have made outstanding personal contributions to naval architecture, marine or ocean engineering, or allied disciplines through significant achievements in design, research, production, operation, education, or associated management. A candidate shall have attained the grade of Member and have had not less than ten (10) years of active practice."

A candidate for the grade of Fellow must be nominated by an initiator and two endorsers, all by whom need to be Fellows or Members of SNAME. The approved form needs to be used for the nomination. The Fellows Committee will approve candidates and report the new selections to the Council.

Responsibility of Sponsors and the Fellows Committee

The Fellows Committee depends heavily upon the documentation provided to evaluate a nominee's qualifications for recognition as a Fellow of SNAME. It is understood that the nature of the contributions can vary widely depending on the segment of the marine industry in which the individual participates and the particular functions the individual performs.

Information describing the nominee's outstanding contributions to the marine profession should be as explicit as possible. Sponsoring letters should avoid repetition of information provided on the nomination form and should strive to provide documentation from different perspectives based on personal knowledge of how the candidate's contributions have benefited the marine industry.

Sponsoring letters are very important for validating the contributions and their specific value to the profession. Ideally, sponsors should be sought based upon their personal knowledge of the individual's contributions and sponsor's expertise in the area and understanding of the significance of the particular contributions to the profession. Sponsors should ideally come from varied sources to validate comprehensively the nominee's outstanding contributions.

The nomination should be forwarded as a complete package consisting of the initiating individual's detailed letter of recommendation, the completed nomination form for Fellow that includes the nominee's background information that substantiates the requirements of the bylaws, and letters of recommendation from two individuals supporting the nomination.

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
